### Oaklands continues to be ignored

After speaking with residents on Oaklands, many have been shocked by the lack of repairs since last May - exposed wiring, damp patches, mould and missing window panes are still very visible.

Former Conservative Councillor Tim Briggs repeatedly called for Oaklands to be brought up to acceptable standards.

These calls remain unanswered. Conservatives will continue to stand up for local residents.

We thank the local police for their work over recent months in dispersing groups of local youths gathering outside Eastman House after dark, which has made residents feel safer.





#### **Labour Lambeth's Bungled Housing Policies**

Homes for Lambeth (HfL), the Council's arms-length body set up to oversee house building, has been handed plenty of money over the years, but has yet to show results.

Since 2017, HfL has burnt through over £20million of your money, with an extra £9million given recently, and delivered a paltry 40 homes. So appalling is its record that an independent report has recommended that the programme be closed down and brought back in-house.

Lambeth Council is badly failing residents. The housing ombudsman recently found Lambeth Council guilty of "severe maladministration" and the Government's Minister for Housing, Michael Gove, named and shamed Lambeth Council due to its disregard for people's living conditions – providing examples of people living in mouldy accommodation for far too long.

### **Crime Update**

There has been a recent surge in levels of street muggings and theft in Clapham.

Speaking to residents in Clapham, it is clear that the rise in crime is a leading concern. We are currently discussing with local police about the worrying numbers of both muggings, mainly for jewellery & watches, and of car/car part thefts.

Overall Lambeth's crime rate is 8% higher than the London average and Lambeth ranks in the top 10 most dangerous boroughs in London.

Conservative Councillors spent time developing strong relations with the police in order to address crime concerns and ensure people's safety.
